Evaluation Methods Used: A combination of automated and manual accessibility assessment techniques were used to evaluate the Admissions application. Automated assessment was done on all pages whereas manual testing using assistive technology was performed on some of the selective pages representative of the application as a whole. The technology platforms on which the testing was performed were Linux, Chrome 79.
