Time-Consuming Manual Labor

Until 2013, Purdue University College of Veterinary Medicine (PVM) tracked its applicants' progress by using Excel spreadsheets, while spending an inordinate amount of time printing out all the requisite application materials.

Yet Lori Stout, the admissions process manager at PVM, assumed her position a year after the college had already embarked on the journey

of transforming and modernizing its process by joining VMCAS™, the cloud-based Centralized Application Service (CAS™) which Liaison launched in partnership with the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges (AAVMC).

The customizable VMCAS platform enables Stout and her staff to tighten up their admissions processes each year — particularly through the new releases and features in WebAdMIT™, the online portal within the CAS, which allows schools to communicate with applicants more seamlessly and work with evaluators more efficiently.

“Having data and information at your fingertips has really helped us make better-informed decisions and ultimately helps us shape our classes at Purdue,” Stout says.

Additionally, the CAS reporting features have equipped PVM with crucial data that the veterinary school's in-house statistician can analyze to determine trends and outcomes, further enhancing the College's capability to make well-informed strategic decisions.

For instance, after evaluating outcome data from its applicants and looking into studies that explored the potential biases of standardized tests, PVM decided to eliminate the GRE and calculus as prerequisites for admission — a judgment call which Stout believes has “helped us to better shape our incoming classes, because we can more closely hone in on what makes each applicant unique and what they might bring to our community. VMCAS gives us the actionable data that we didn't have before.”

PURDUE UNIVERSITY'S OUTCOME

Substantial Time Savings for Staff and Students Alike

According to Stout, VMCAS has helped the College save up to 90% of the time that it had devoted to its previous admissions process, freeing up the staff for more strategic efforts. PVM was able to reallocate the roles and responsibilities of current staffers, while expanding its team by hiring the aforementioned statistician. Each year, the time savings increase as new CAS features are launched and the institution implements best practices learned from the CAS community.

“Currently, we're analyzing the landscape for community college students and their success rates, including how we can better serve students who apply and matriculate from community colleges. Without VMCAS, our staff simply wouldn't have the time and resources for such strategic efforts,” Stout says.

Prospective students, meanwhile, are saving both time and money through PVM's more seamless CAS-powered application process.
